1. Head and Beak:

- Cast on 24 stitches in light brown.
- Knit 2 rows.
- Bind off 2 stitches at the beginning of the next 2 rows.
- Knit 2 rows.
- Bind off 1 stitch at the beginning of the next 4 rows.
- Knit 2 rows.
- Bind off all remaining stitches.

2. Neck:

- Cast on 14 stitches in cream.
- Knit 3 rows.

3. Body:

- Cast on 30 stitches in cream.
- Knit 24 rows.

4. **Comb:**

- Cast on 8 stitches in light brown.
- Knit 4 rows.
- Bind off.

5. Wings:

- Cast on 10 stitches in cream.
- Knit 4 rows.
- Bind off.

6. Tail:

- Cast on 8 stitches in cream.
- Knit 6 rows.
- Bind off.

7. Assembly:

• Stitch the neck to the top of the head.

- Tuck the comb into the back of the head and sew into place.
- Sew the body to the neck.
- Embroider a small black eye on each side of the head.
- Sew the wings to the sides of the body.
- Sew the tail to the back of the body.

Chicken B:

Follow the same instructions as for Chicken A, but make the following adjustments:

- Use less light brown yarn for the beak, just enough to create a small, pointy shape.
- Add a small, cream-colored wattle to the underside of the beak.
- Omit the comb.

Finishing:

- Fill each chicken with toy stuffing.

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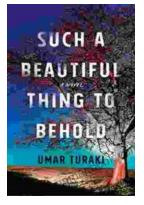
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
